We are a welcoming community formed in Christ, committed to sharing his love with others – with feet that carry us out into the world, with hands that serve, and with hearts in fellowship and faith.


Dear Friends,

As we prepare to turn the page on 2024 and transition to a new year, I've been thinking a great deal about *time*. Looking back on the year that was, I've been considering whether I used my time wisely. And looking ahead, I've been thinking about how best to use my time in 2025.






Calling all Knitters...and Crochet-ers!




